We are delighted to share with you the recent accomplishments for the second half of 2017.

The second half of the year began with completion of three programmes of IASP-ISSP Multidisciplinary Pain Management Programme in first week of July 2017. We thank Dr Preeti Doshi & Dr Sushma Bhatnagar for taking the lead roles and successfully accomplishing the programme.

This year the 'World Pain Awareness Day' was celebrated widely across the country by various state/city branches and of course individual members on July 9th 2017. The success story continues. We would like to continue our efforts in making this event a global affair.

INDIAN ACADEMY OF PAIN MEDICINE

It is with great pleasure I write the synopsis of the activities and achievements of the Indian Academy of Pain Medicine – the academy of Indian Society for the Study of Pain. The year 2017 has been a crossover period, where the leadership was passed on by the committee chaired by Dr. Gehdoo to the newly elected office bearers under the leadership of Dr. Bibhukalyani Das and Dr. Pradeep Jain. High achievement always takes place within the framework of high expectation, and considerable progress has been made this year towards meeting the high expectations of our membership.

From the trainees' perspective, the logbook in the form of a mobile app has been developed and suggestions to improve it have been incorporated where possible. It is available only in the Android version for now, but efforts are already underway to develop the iOS version. We hope it will be available before the end of 2017. Moreover, the IAPM has developed a comprehensive Trainee Quarterly Assessment Form in order to help identify the lacunae in training as well identify the processes for continual improvement. This is now a mandatory submission to be eligible to sit the exam.

The pathways to the training and fellowship are now much more clearer than when we started 2017. The Entrance exams for embarking on a one-year training in IAPM/ISSP accredited centre is now well established. The entrance exam this year is scheduled at Kolkata this December and the number of applicants is more than that of last year. Three new centres have been accredited this year to provide training towards the fellowship of IAPM: Belle Vue Clinic - Kolkata, Cheers Interventional Pain Management - Ahmedabad and Yashoda Hospital - Hyderabad.

The eligibility criteria for sitting the Exit exam have now been better defined. The IAPM trainees and other trainees (from university accredited program, private fellowship & overseas training) are eligible to appear for the exit exam, provided they satisfy the criteria laid out by the IAPM. Similarly, senior pain physicians with five years or more of ISSP membership and the requisite publications could, with adequate recommendations, appear for the Exit exam. The exit exam is scheduled at Delhi in January 2018.

With regard to the exit exam, one could expect a slew of announcements from IAPM with regard to the format of the exam, marking system, centres where it would be held, application form, guidance notes for the application form etc., and they will all be available at www.issp-pain.org, in our social media pages and by email to the membership from the ISSP/IAPM headquarters. We very much look forward to the conferring ceremony of the first IAPM fellows during the ISSPCON 2018.

There are many other accomplishments that are now *de rigueur* such as the quick email responses from the IAPM headquarters, regular updates to the website and responsible use of social media. What would be somewhat disappointing to our members is the restriction on the number of candidates IAPM could admit for the exit exam in January 2018. This restriction is firstly to understand the logistics of conducting the exam smoothly and secondly due to the overarching idea of fashioning a well-organised and prestigious exam to pass. In other news, the expenses of IAPM are now budgeted and streamlined, and as the Treasurer of ISSP I could foresee a prolonged period of excellent financial support for most of the projects and improvements that IAPM has in store. The appreciation for IAPM that has been pouring in from various quarters has not only reinforced the belief that it is on the right path, but has also inspired it to fly higher.



The IAPM is up and running. Yet there is much to be done in the near and medium term. A trainee handbook, an all-encompassing document, which will be of use to current and future trainees, is an urgent need, as it will remove ambiguities and doubts that might plague their minds with regard to training, preparing for exams etc., We should, in addition, provide better value for IAPM trainees by the way of exam refresher courses, online teaching modules, mentorship, video tutorials such as on physical examination, trainee newsletter and a trainee luncheon during ISSPCON.

It would do us no harm in having examiners trained with relevant workshops, and none at all in having the exams standardized and audited. To conduct online entrance exams and increase the number of sittings of the exit exams are other issues to be considered. Finally, advocacy efforts towards having pain medicine recognized as a speciality by the NBE, and the meticulous data collection required to support us in this bid seems a very worthy cause. These future endeavours have been in the mind of governing council members of ISSP and IAPM; and it is only a matter of time before they all come to fruition.

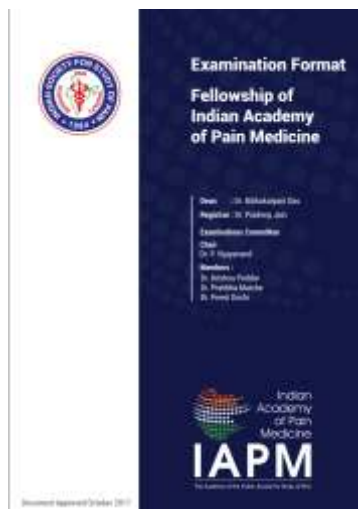

Andhra Pradesh State Chapter Activities

The Andhra Pradesh Chapter of ISSP along with ISA (Indian Society of Anesthesiologists) National, Australia & New Zealand College of Anesthetists (ANZCA), WFSA (World Federation of Societies of Anesthesiologists) and KIMS (Kona Seema Institute of Medical Sciences & Research Centre) conducted a workshop on Essential Pain Management (EPM) Lite Programme for 100 undergraduate medical students on 7th October 2017 (SMARC 2017). This was part of the Undergraduate National Conference being held at same institution for third year in succession. We congratulate them for conducting three times in a row. More than 600 students from 13 medical colleges were attending this event as delegates. There were another 5 workshops pertaining to BLS/ACLS, Radiology, Suturing Skills, Orthopedic tricks so on and so forth

The Dean of institution (KIMS) Dr Kameswar Rao (Past President of ISSP) expressed that the workshop was oversubscribed, the organizing team had tough time in limiting workshop delegates. The EPM programme is happening in more than 45 countries and the certificate is valid across all these countries spread over the world. The programme consisted of pretest, interactive sessions, group discussions, posttest, feedback and certification. With the overwhelming response received every year the Dean resolved that EPM Lite programme will be a permanent feature of this conference.



ISSP STATE CHAPTER ACTIVITIES

Chandigarh UT Chapter Activities

The Chandigarh Chapter of ISSP conducted a CME on 11.11.2017 at the Government Medical College and Hospital (GMCH), Chandigarh. The Theme of the CME was: "Walking together hand in hand – pain and palliative care."

With increasing life expectancy and advances in medicine, more and more persons with serious life-threatening diseases needing palliative care are living longer. Pain is probably the most common and most distressing of all the symptoms in palliative care. At times, excruciating and relentless pain becomes a more important pressing issue than the fear of death itself. In fact, relieving the pain can ease the death so that the person can at least pass away in peace.

The eminent speakers, chairpersons and panelists shared their knowledge and expertise so that the budding doctors of tomorrow can treat their patients in pain with adequate knowledge, skills and with a respectful attitude. The speakers and panelists consisted of anaesthesiologists, pain physicians, surgeon and radiotherapist from Postgraduate Institute of Medical Education & Research (PGIMER) Chandigarh, GMCH, and the private sector. Dr. Jeetinder Makkar spoke on opioids in non-cancer pain. Dr AK Dalal and Dr Sushmita Ghoshal talked on palliative oncosurgery and palliative radiotherapy, respectively. Dr Dheeraj Kapoor deliberated on the sensitive topic of euthanasia in the context of pain and palliative care. Dr Minni Arora dealt with hospice care.

In addition to the didactic lectures, there were two lively "Pro-Con" sessions. The first one was "Is WHO analgesic ladder step 2 still valid for palliative pain management?" and the second one on "Opening the Pandora's Box: Can opioids actually cause cancer progression? And does it matter?" The CME ended with a practically oriented panel moderated by Dr. Sukanya Mitra with the theme: "Old lamps for new ones? Opioids at the sunset!" using a real-life case vignette and specific management related questions.

The programme was well attended and left the interactive audience with a lasting impression of the importance and timeliness of this theme.
