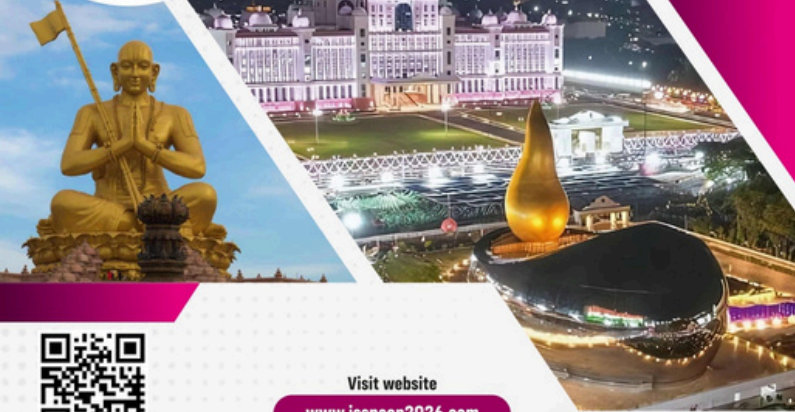

Subject: Representation on the Emerging Super-specialty of Pain Medicine

Greetings,

The Indian Society for Study of Pain (ISSP), established in 1984, is a registered national body representing more than 3400 Pain Physicians nationwide and serves as the Indian Chapter of the International Association for the Study of Pain (IASP). ISSP is dedicated to the advancement of awareness, research, treatment, and advocacy for chronic pain patients and Pain Physicians across India. Our official website is www.issp-pain.org, and we have been publishing the *Indian Journal of Pain (IJP)* for over three decades.

Chronic pain affects approximately 20–30% of the global population. In India, the burden is even greater, with a prevalence of 36.6 % among individuals aged over 45 years — effectively one in every three Indians suffers from chronic pain. This results in significant healthcare, psychosocial, and economic impacts on society. **(Annexure-1: Indian studies on pain prevalence and its consequences.)**

Chronic pain may arise from a spectrum of etiologies including degenerative spine and joint disorders, myofascial syndromes such as fibromyalgia, neuralgias like trigeminal neuralgia and post-herpetic neuralgia, cancer-related pain, among others — all requiring dedicated and specialized management strategies.

Historically, chronic pain management was subsumed within acute care models, relying predominantly on long-term pharmacotherapy or surgical interventions, both associated with considerable risks and economic burdens. Over recent decades, however, *Pain Medicine* has evolved as a distinct specialty. Pain Physicians now employ comprehensive, multimodal approach encompassing lifestyle interventions, pharmacological management, and the highly specialized domain of *Minimally Invasive Pain and Spine Interventions (MIPSI)*.

MIPSI serve as a pivotal bridge between conservative management and invasive surgical procedures, offering long-term relief with minimal morbidity, faster rehabilitation, and reduced healthcare costs. Their transformative impact on pain management is analogous to how Percutaneous Coronary Interventions (PCI) revolutionized cardiac care by significantly reducing the need for open-heart surgeries.

Representative examples of MIPSI include:

- Intra-articular injections for degenerative joint conditions
- Neurolysis and plexus rhizolysis for cancer-related pain
- Radiofrequency ablation for spinal, joint, neuralgic, and oncological pain syndromes
- Minimally invasive endoscopic procedures for disc prolapse and lumbar canal stenosis
- Regenerative therapies (e.g., Platelet-Rich Plasma, Growth Factor Concentrate, Bone Marrow Aspirate Concentrate) for musculoskeletal pathologies

- Percutaneous cementoplasty for fragility fractures secondary to osteoporosis or metastatic disease

Recognizing the significance of Pain Medicine, the National Medical Commission (NMC, formerly MCI) has integrated it into the MD Anaesthesiology curriculum, mandating clinical exposure through Pain Clinic postings, and has designated Radiofrequency Pain Management Generators and associated equipment as essential infrastructure for Departments of Anaesthesiology. Govt. Of Uttar Pradesh has also started a separate super-specialty department of Pain Medicine at GSVM Medical College, Kanpur under PMSSY Scheme. **(Annexure 3-Order of Goup for various posts in Dept. Of Pain Medicine)**

Pain Medicine is steadily progressing as a super-specialty within Anaesthesiology. Currently, three AIIMS institutes (Rishikesh, Gorakhpur, Mangalgi) offer DM programs in Pain Medicine. Additionally, numerous premier institutions across India conduct structured one- or two-year programs (PDCC/PDF/PDAF) in Pain Medicine. To further address the need for trained specialists, the Indian Academy of Pain Medicine (the academic wing of ISSP) has instituted a formalized one-year training program across accredited centres. Moreover, the National Board of Examinations in Medical Sciences (NBEMS) now offers a two-year FNB in Pain Medicine at leading centres nationwide.

(Annexure 4-List of Pain Medicine Educational Programs in India.)

Globally, countries such as the United States, United Kingdom, Australia, Canada, and Singapore have established Pain Medicine as a recognized super-specialty. Several ISSP members have pursued extensive training overseas and are currently serving Indian patients with the benefit of their international experience.

In parallel, multiple reputed medical institutions have submitted applications to the NMC to initiate DM programs in Pain Medicine, while PDCC in Pain Management is already recognized by the NMC.

It is pertinent to acknowledge that, as with the development of every emerging specialty — such as Cardiology, Endocrine Surgery, Neurosurgery, and Interventional Radiology — Pain Medicine is undergoing a natural evolutionary phase. In this journey, early practitioners — who passionately laid the foundation — may not possess formal super-specialty degrees, similar to the pioneers in fields like Orthopedics, Neurosurgery, or Cardiology. Resistance or scepticism from traditional quarters is, therefore, not unexpected, and often stems from limited exposure to contemporary global practices.

It must also be emphasized that procedural overlaps among specialties are an established feature of modern medicine. For instance, thyroid surgeries are performed by general surgeons, endocrine surgeons, ENT specialists, and at times maxillofacial surgeons. Similarly, hair transplant procedures are conducted by both plastic surgeons and dermatologists. In the same vein, several MIPSIs are performed by Pain Physicians as well as by neurosurgeons, Orthopedic surgeons, physiatrists (PMR specialists), and interventional radiologists.

In this pivotal period of growth, ISSP remains committed to:

1. Raising awareness about the field of Pain Medicine
2. Promoting ethical, evidence-based practices among its members
3. Safeguarding the interests of millions of chronic pain patients across the country

Concerns Regarding Misrepresentation and Undermining of Pain Medicine in various conferences/ workshops

Dear ISSP Members

It has come to the attention of ISSP Headquarters that several ISSP members are involved in organizing multiple conferences and workshops on Chronic Pain which are being *openly advertised to all specialties*, and in some cases even to *anyone interested in Pain Medicine*—regardless of their qualifications or background.

Such an approach is not only damaging to the long-standing efforts of our National Body ISSP to establish Pain Medicine as a recognized super-specialty under Anaesthesiology, but also highly disrespectful to the rigor and dedication of those pursuing formal training in this field.

We must remember that DM, FNB, PDCC, PDAF, and FIAPM Fellows, along with their mentors, are committing 1–3 years of intensive training to master the nuances of Pain Medicine—especially complex techniques like Minimally Invasive Pain and Spine Interventions (MIPSI's).

Opening workshops of this nature to an unregulated audience dilutes the academic and clinical value of Pain Medicine and compromises both patient safety and professional integrity.

ISSP is taking this matter seriously and urges all stakeholders to recognize the importance of structured training, ethical representation,

and responsible promotion of our super-specialty and refrain from imparting the intricate knowledge of our niche MIPSIs indiscriminately.

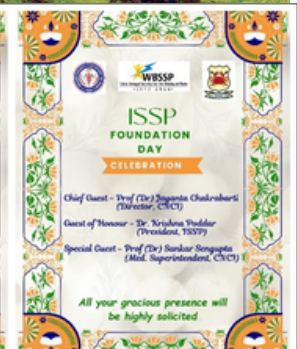
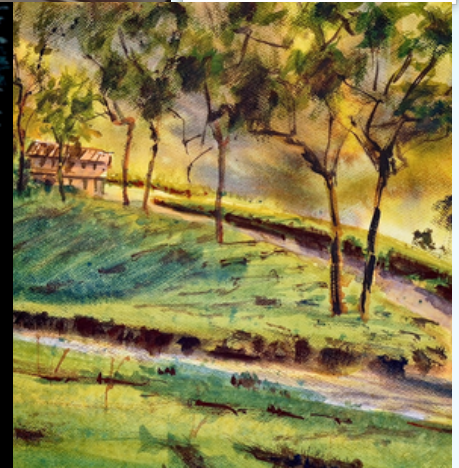
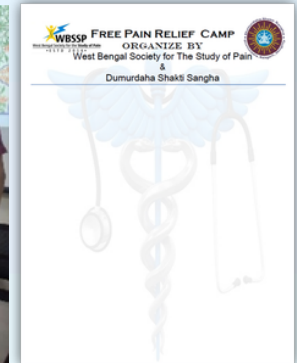
West Bengal State Chapter

IAPM EXAM UPDATES

Passing requirements:

- Pass percentage is 50% and the candidates will have to secure 50% in each category i.e. Written exam, Viva and Practical exam.

FIAPM Exit Exam Prerequisite Information

- Application for IAPM Exit Examination can be submitted under 4 categories. IAPM Category, Non-IAPM Category, One-year Fellowship outside India Category, Senior Pain Physicians Category. The eligibility Criteria are as follows.

Common requirements for all Categories

- **Medical License:** Candidates applying for the exit examination should have a valid unrestricted medical license, they need to submit a copy of NMC/ SMC registration.
- **Membership of ISSP:** Candidates applying for the exit examination should have ISSP Membership. Associate members of ISSP or candidates who are not Anaesthesiology postgraduates (MD, DA or DNB in Anaesthesiology) cannot appear for the exams.
- **Publication** – Candidates applying for the exit examination should have the publication in chronic pain
- **Post-Graduation Certificate in Anesthesiology** (MD – Anesthesiology, Diploma in Anesthesiology or DNB in Anesthesiology)

Category wise Additional requirements

IAPM Category

- Trainees of IAPM who have entered IAPM-accredited training centres through the IAPM Entry Examination and completed a full year of Training in IAPM-accredited centres.
- One publication is mandatory on chronic pain in a Peer-Reviewed Journal.

Non-IAPM Category

- One-year full-time residential fellowship programme in Pain Medicine from any Private organisation, the program head of the said program should be FIAPM qualified
- Structural program fellow from an Indian university (Completed a fully residential university-accredited structured pain training program of minimum one-year duration and passed successfully)
- One publication is mandatory on chronic pain.3
- Affidavit stating One year completion of full-time fellowship in Pain Medicine.
- Completion certificate of one year Full-Time training in Pain Medicine from the Head of the Institute.

One-year Fellowship Outside India Category

- Completed full residential fellowship outside India of minimum 1-year duration & currently practising in India.
- One publication is mandatory on chronic pain.³

Senior Pain Physicians Category

- Recommendation letter from GC member of ISSP/IAPM. (Recommendation letter will include duration of pain practice, number of patients in pain OPD & procedures) it should be on official letterhead with the physical signature of the GC (**Additional Affidavit may be asked by the Examination committee**)

1. The application for the exit exam and the required documents are to be submitted online only,
2. You will receive an email from the Registrar's office confirming your eligibility and approval for the exam. In case your application is not approved by the Registrar, you will be informed and your Fees will be refunded to the source of payment. Portal Charges are non-refundable.

3. Publication is mandatory for all the categories applying for the exit exam

- For Senior Pain Physicians: **2 publications** are mandatory of which one should be compulsory in chronic pain.
- All other categories (IAPM, Non-IAPM, Overseas): **1 publication** in chronic pain.
- The publications that have already been published will be considered only, not those under acceptance.
- Exception – Only for IAPM trainees (Manuscript submission letter in Indian Journal of Pain only.) will also be accepted.
- Publications must be in a Peer Reviewed Journal or Book Chapters.
- Publications in the conference books will not be accepted.

4. Cancellation Policy – Once approved by the review committee Exam fee is non-refundable

1. Under exceptional situations like the ill health of the candidate or the death of a family member, you can apply to the registrar with supportive documents. A partial refund may be allowed subject to the approval of IAPM GC, as per the policy mentioned below –
 - From the date of approval to 2 weeks before the exam – 50% refund (Excluding the portal Charges)
 - From 2 weeks before the exam to the Date of the exam – No refund
2. The exam fees will not be carried forward to the next exam.

Advisory on NMC Guidelines for Live Telecast of the Procedures

Issued by: Indian Academy of Pain Medicine (IAPM), academic wing of Indian Society for Study of Pain (ISSP)

(Based on the latest National Medical Commission guidelines, 26 July 2025)

1. Purpose & Applicability

The National Medical Commission (NMC) has released updated regulations on the conduct of live procedures to enhance patient safety and uphold ethical standards. This advisory aims to guide all members of the **Indian Society for Study of Pain** in complying with these regulations when organizing, performing, or participating in live procedure demonstrations.

2. Key Guidelines

Educational Intent Only

- Live procedural broadcasts must be undertaken **solely for academic and educational purposes**.
- Promotional activities for Pain Physicians, hospitals, or medical devices through live procedures are **strictly prohibited**.

Applicable Procedures

- **Permitted:** Only **new, innovative, or advanced techniques** may be showcased in live broadcasts.
- **Not Permitted:** Routine, high-risk, or well-established procedures should not be broadcast live. Instead, **recorded or simulation-based teaching** is recommended.

3. Patient Safety, Consent & Cost

ISSP Advisory on Live Workshops as per NMC Guidelines

- **Written informed consent** must be obtained, detailing the educational purpose, potential risks, and the patient's right to withdraw.
- Patients must not bear any additional cost, and **no financial incentives** can be offered.
- Hospitals/organizers must ensure **insurance coverage** for the procedure and any complications arising from the procedure.

4. Prior Approval Requirement

- **Prior approval is mandatory** from the NMC or the relevant **State Medical Council** before conducting any live procedural broadcast.
- The application must include details of the procedure, Pain physicians credentials, patient consent, hospital infrastructure, and insurance arrangements.

5. Regulations for International Faculty

- Foreign medical practitioners participating in live procedure demonstrations must:
 - Obtain **temporary registration/permission** from the NMC and relevant State Medical Council.
 - Demonstrate proof of qualifications and international experience.
 - Abide by the same ethical and patient safety norms as Indian physicians.

6. Venue & Technical Requirements

- Live procedures must be conducted only in **accredited hospitals** with adequate ICU, operative facilities, and safety protocols.
- The operating physicians must focus on patient care; **interactions with the audience must be mediated by a moderator.**
- Organizers must maintain **unedited video recordings** of the procedure for at least **2 years.**

7. Exception for In-House Demonstrations

- These NMC restrictions **do not apply** to **in-house live demonstrations** of **Interventional Pain and Spine procedures**, including **Spine Endoscopy**, conducted:
 - **Within the same institution** for internal faculty training.
 - **Without external broadcast or commercial promotion.**
 - Under existing institutional protocols with patient consent and standard safety measures.

8. Recommendations for ISSP Members

1. **Strictly adhere to NMC guidelines** for all national/international workshops.
2. **Seek prior NMC or State Medical Authority approval** for all live procedural broadcasts involving external participants.
3. **Take international faculty permissions** well in advance.
4. **Prefer pre-recorded videos, cadaver labs, or simulation-based teaching** for standard procedures.
5. Maintain **complete documentation**—consents, approvals, and recordings—for audit and medico-legal compliance.

9. Conclusion

By aligning with the **latest NMC directives**, the Indian Academy of Pain Medicine ensures that live procedural demonstrations are conducted with the **highest ethical standards, patient safety as the top priority, and compliance with legal frameworks.**

The exemption for **in-house demonstrations** allows continued **skill development** in pain and spine interventions while adhering to regulatory expectations.
